E te whānau, lodge your claim as soon as possible. Remember to take notes and photos of all damage, of any damage you're repairing (to make your whare safe and drive) to add to your insurance claim. Contact your insurer before carrying out non-essential repairs, and if you do need to throw out items, such as perished kai, take photos of these too. If needed, also talk with your insurer about temporary accommodation support.
