I am responding on behalf of Hauora Tairāwhiti (Tairāwhiti DHB) to your OIA Request of 26 November regarding adverse drug reactions.

Please see our response to your questions below:

Number and location of PET (positron emission tomography) and PET-CT (positron emission tomography-computed tomography) scanning machines in NZ? We don't have a PET-CT machine. We refer to Hamilton Radiology for these scans.

Current working condition of each of these machines -for example whether they are in top working condition, in need of upgrade/refurbishment, or broken? We don't hold any detail on the location of machines nationally or their state of operation.

The timeline and anticipated cost for the repair or replacement of any PET or PETCT machines which are currently broken or in need of upgrade/refurbishment? Not applicable.
