I am responding on behalf of Hauora Tairāwhiti (Tairāwhiti DHB) to your OIA Request of 7 January 2019 regarding alcohol harm reduction activities .

You asked our DHB:

Public Health regulatory activity related to alcohol

As part of Hauora Tairawhiti Ministry of Health contract the following regulatory activities are undertaken:

a) Licensing inquiries including education activities with local organisations and businesses

regarding the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act and licensing process;

- b) Reporting to District Licensing Committee;
- c) Providing information and/or attendance at licensing hearings;
- d) Input into Local Alcohol Plans (LAP);
- e) Assist in Controlled Purchase Operations (Police-lead);
- f) Collaborate/monitor with Police and Inspectors.

Involvement with policy development with each Council in the Tairawhiti area Hauora Tairawhiti has provided feedback into the development of the Gisborne joint alcohol policy.

The costs incurred in preparing each submission submitted to central and local government on alcohol issues

The submissions made to Councils within your DHB area on alcohol licensing applications for all on-license, off-license, club and special event licenses and special event licenses and the cost incurred in doing so Hauora Tairawhiti reported on 173 applications from July 2017 to July 2018. With no objections.
